Bhaskar Chakravorti is the Senior Associate Dean of International Business & Finance at Tufts' Fletcher School and founding Executive Director of Fletcher's Institute for Business in the Global Context. The institute's objective is to "connect the world of business with the world." Dean Chakravorti serves on the World Economic Forum's Global Future Council on Innovation and Entrepreneurship, is an advisory board member for the UNDP's IICPSD, based in Istanbul, a non-resident senior fellow at the Brookings Institution India, and the Senior Advisor for Digital Inclusion at the MasterCard Center for Inclusive Growth. He is also the organizer of the highly regarded "Greece's Turn?" conference in Boston, which is part of the "Turn?" series of conferences hosted by Fletcher. He is a regular columnist for Harvard Business Review, Forbes, Indian Express, Huffington Post, and a former columnist on innovation for the Washington Post. He is the author of the Amazon.com best-selling book, *The Slow Pace of Fast Change*. His papers and articles appear in top-tier academic journals, multiple books, and in widely read media, e.g., the New York Times, Wall Street Journal, Financial Times, Washington Post, CNN, Foreign Affairs, BusinessWeek, and CNBC. Prior to joining Tufts, he was a Partner of McKinsey & Company, on the faculty of Harvard Business School, and a distinguished scholar at MIT's Legatum Center. He was a leader of McKinsey's Innovation and Global Forces practices and taught innovation and entrepreneurship at Harvard. In a 20-plus-year career, he has been an advisor to CEOs and senior management of more than 30 companies in the Fortune 500 and worked across the Americas, EU, Asia, and Africa, and multiple industries. Dean Chakravorti's Ph.D. in economics is from the University of Rochester, his M.A. from the Delhi School of Economics, and B.A. (honors) from Delhi University's St. Stephen's College.
